Exodus 22 : 22 - 26

God warns the Israelites they must never molest or oppress the alien among them since they too were aliens in the land of Egypt. God goes on to include anyone who is weak or powerless in society among those who must never be oppressed or shamed or looked down upon. The Israelites are to be compassionate as God is compassionate. Everyone's dignity must remain intact.

1 Thessalonians 1 : 5 - 10

Paul encourages the Thessalonians by reminding them that they received the Word of God and made it the driving force of their lives. They lived it so well, their fame spread far and wide, making them examples of how well to live the faith they had received.
